


OUR STORY

Established in 1984, Te Kairanga is an important part of the Martinborough wine story. Our vines are planted on land that was originally owned by the founding father of Martinborough, John Martin.

While our land is steeped in history, our winemaking is very much focused on the future; "to fully realise the potential of this incredible piece of land," according to our Head Winemaker John Kavanagh.

MARTINBOROUGH

Located at the foot of New Zealand's North Island.

Accounts for only 2% of New Zealand's wine production.

Protected from the harsh elements by a range of mountains to the southwest and west, it has a mild, breezy, dry climate, ideal for cool-climate grape growing. Our ideal confluence of geology and geography is the perfect climate and terrain to produce exceptional Pinot Noir.



OUR CELLAR DOOR

Housed in the 130-year old cottage of Martinborough's namesake, John Martin.

Once home to John Martin's senior stockman, today the cottage is home to our award-winning wines showcasing the bounty of our incredible landscape.

With it's rustic aesethic, inviting surrounding and intimate setting, it's a central location to discover and experience our place.



OUR VINEYARDS

Four vineyard sites in the Martinborough appellation. Home, McLeod, Spring Rock and Rua Vineyards.

This gives us a wide array of aromatics, flavours, textures and styles to work with.

The Martinborough Terrace, is home to our Home and McLeod Vineyards and some of the oldest vines in the region. Once a riverbed, it features deep ancient gravel and alluvial soils. A soil type that is unique and definitive for the varieties that we do well with.

Our Spring Rock and Rua vineyards sit at slightly higher elevations with more extreme conditions. This intense environment helps give us a greater balance to our wines.



OUR WINEMAKING

We produce wines that are very distinct.

We have a real curiosity to keep experimenting and perfecting. So long as it's a true expression of where we are.

Our winemaking philosophy places a premium on the character of each vineyard.

Gentle winemaking techniques and minimal filtration ensure our wines maintain their fresh flavour and distinct characters.

RUNHOLDER PINOT NOIR



A nod to Martinborough's pioneering namesake John Martin, who once farmed our land with sheep, earning him the name of 'runholder'. This Pinot Noir is sourced from our home vineyards planted on his original land holdings. Beautiful dark red hues lead to an aromatic flurry of cherries, spices and classic Martinborough savoury, earthy notes. The palate displays vibrant fruit flavours finishing with fine silky tannins.

JOHN MARTIN CHARDONNAY

Named after the founding father of Martinborough, John Martin, this wine is made from our best vineyard parcels and some of the oldest vines in the region. Complex and rich aromas of stone fruits accented by roasted nuts and brioche make this a beautiful chardonnay in more ways than one. A rich, yet elegant palate leads to a long, rounded finish.
